



**Wired for Travel /** Speaking of pockets, Scott Jordan says he’s “in the pocket business.” But his SCOTTTeVEST trademarked “technology-enabled clothing” is about much more than the up-to-30 pockets that each piece contains. His jackets wire in electronic devices for easy use. His well-received line of clothing just debuted solar panel-equipped garments that charge your cell phone and PDA. He conceived his “personal area network” cord conduit system for “a wireless world that seems to be full of wires.”

Embraced by business travelers, tech geeks, the FBI, Secret Service—and even sold in the International Spy Museum store in Washington, DC (see page 38)—the gear is both good-looking and functional. Jordan, a former corporate lawyer turned travel gear innovator, complains that “mainstream designers just care about how things look, not about how they work.”

New from SCOTTTeVEST this month is a shorts version of its Hidden Cargo khaki slacks that combines a plethora of travel pockets with easy access and wire corridors for an MP3 player or cell phone. A fashionable, recently introduced leather jacket has nearly sold out, but expect a more Euro-style leather coat by August (scottevest.com).
